

Property Crime 2021

Washoe County

This theme covers the property crime offenses of burglary, motor vehicle theft, larceny and arson. Victims are always counted individually though there could be multiple victims / offenders per crime.

The data and charts in this theme are now based on detailed incident reports and are available starting in 2021. Data for those agencies who submitted detailed incident reports prior to 2021, as well as historical less detailed data, can be seen in the reports on the [Public Reporting site](#). Themes do not display every offense type that is collected. Examples of items not included in a theme are Human Trafficking offenses and DUI arrests. PROPERTY CRIME


The offender's intent in a property crime (burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson) is to gain money, property or some other benefit.

Note that a property crime incident may contain multiple offenses and each offense is counted as one crime, except for motor vehicle theft where crimes are counted as any attempted motor vehicle thefts plus the number of stolen motor vehicles.



Note that this chart shows values for all crimes that are classified as property crimes, not only those highlighted in this theme.


BURGLARY

Crimes: 1,678 **Clearance: 16.39%**








ENTRY TYPE


The theft of a motor vehicle (defined as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land).


AUTOS 5-YEAR TREND

Motor Vehicle Theft




TRUCKS & BUSES 5-YEAR TREND








NUMBER OF INCIDENTS BY PROPERTY LOSS VALUE










CRIMES BY MONTH

VALUE OF BURNED PROPERTIES








ARRESTEE AGE


ARRESTEE GENDER
